<u>ANTHOLOGY COMMITTEE UPDATE – DI TOM HESSLER</u>

The Anthology Committee is on schedule to have all the on-time submittals reviewed by April 1st and returned by May 1st; (some will be distributed at the April monthly meeting).

If your work has been "accepted with minor changes" you do not need to do anything further, unless we have suggested that you make some changes and you wish to do so. Minor changes may include punctuation, spelling or re-formatting. Please understand that although you may have submitted several works, they may not all be accepted.

"Accepted with minor changes" means accepted for consideration to be included.

We want each of the authors who have submitted to have at least one of their works published. Beyond that, we need to decide when we review all "accepted" entries to determine if more than one entry per author will be included. This will depend on the size of the book-pages, etc.

So far, 26 authors have submitted 46 pieces. Good for us!

To those who submitted late:

Those works that were submitted late will be reviewed on April 16th. we will somehow get word to you or return marked-up reviews to you within the following next week. If changes are needed, please fix them and send the work back us no later than May 7th so we may organize and S format the book by June 1st.
