Bet - You Didn't Know by John Powell

Writing is an interesting occupation. You can do it anytime, anywhere, and you can even do it in your underwear. There are a great many things you need to know about this particular skill. In fact it can take years to perfect the talent required of a successful writer. Here are a few facts to help you along the way: "I am." Is the shortest complete sentence in the English language.

There is enough graphite in the average pencil to write 45,000 words.

No word in the English language rhymes with month, orange, silver, or purple.

A successful fiction book sells 5,000 copies.

A successful non-fiction book sells 7,500 copies.

Barbara Cartland, who died in 2000 at 98 years old, wrote 723 books, selling more than a billion copies.

Of all books sold in the US, 52 percent are sold in venues other than bookstores.

Women buy 68 percent of all books sold.

Today, authors should be aware that blogs can lead to books.

Blogs make good sounding boards for reaching readers, editors, and publishers.

The word "set" has more definitions than any other word in the English language.

Is the word you're using current? Do you want it to be?

A lot depends on what you are writing. If the setting for your story is in the 1800s, you don't want to use words that were not in popular usage at that time. If a person who was young many years ago is saying something, it should be different than if a person who is currently a young person is saying it. If you are writing a non-fiction article, you don't want to use yesterday's words. Period.

How do you know which words to use?
