Andrea Roth, aka Andrea (A. K.) Buckroth, will speak on Promoting Your Book Through Marketing and Advertising on Monday, April 8.


Promoting through Marketing and Advertising is necessary and a useable talent. Andrea will explain the slight differences in meaning and usage between the two, but they are relatable.

"How do I sell my book(s)?" is a constant question. This will be addressed with the comeback of "who, what, when, where, how and how much."

Whether an author is traditionally published or self-published, promoting is essential.

Charming picture and chapter books, this three-book series has been illustrated by the author as well as artist Amy Pichly-Meyer of Reno, Nevada.
