Just Around the Riverbend: Tools for Unblocking Your Creative Flow

It's every writer's worst fear: one minute you're flowing along the river of your creativity and then suddenly there's a huge rock blocking the flow, and you can't figure out why it's there or how to get around it. This talk covers the speaker's journey navigating writer's block and coming to terms with the cause. It also will teach tools that she has used herself for removing blocks and allowing her creativity to flow again, including traditional and nontraditional tools from self-help books to role-play. There will also be a 10-minute writing exercise inspired by one of these non-conventional tools: the tarot.

Dvorah ("Dev" for short) Lewis has been writing all of her life and this passion led her to pursue it in all of her endeavors meeting mentors and guides along the way who helped nurture her creativity and skill. She earned her Bachelor's in English with an emphasis in Creative Writing from UC Irvine followed by a Master's in Library & Information Science from UCLA. A few years ago she finally finished a fantasy trilogy she began writing in high school and now she is currently working on revising it with the plans to publish *The Guardian Trilogy*.
