

(*Die Tochter aus der USA ruft wieder an*)... translated: the daughter from USA is on the phone again. A nurse will give her the phone. Mother has dementia and brings lots of stuff together. Like visiting her Father tomorrow. I agree with everything. It is just so nice to hear her voice. I often would like her comfort, like she would do so many years ago, but it is not there.

My oldest son visited me recently and I was told, "Mom, move out. This house it is way too big and the half an acre of yard too." My whole purpose in life was taken away in this moment.

I said to him, "This is all for you guys when you come and visit me. My memories are here, and I am not ready yet." God has given me the power to keep it up. I mow the lawn 14 times a year and the bushes, whenever they need trimming. I have a gardener lined up but as long I can do it, I will. My step daughter is also very helpful with my son in law.

I know many women lost their husbands and are going through what I am going through. It is a load full of responsibility, bills and taxes, all this, my husband took care of.






