

The following is a summary the SSWC intends to pursue to move forward with the Scholarship Fund. In the next couple of months, our goal is to establish new guidelines that will encourage young writers to apply.

1. Content of the submissions, including topics, length, & deadlines.

2. Targeting high schools in Sacramento, El Dorado, and Placer Counties, where advertisements can be posted or given out.

3. Re-visit our funding to establish possible ways to raise funds, i.e., raffles, book sales, donations, or other welcomed ideas.

4. A committee of at least three people is needed to review the submissions. The committee currently has two members but needs one more.

Use as many tiles as possible for a short story, but you can only use a tile once. The story must be original.


It cannot refer to anything related to an alphabet.


