Barnes and Noble Press: An Update

Unlike I reported last month, we do need to convert our Word file into Ingram Spark's acceptable format. Even though Barnes and Noble Press is here, B&N won't place your book on their shelves if all you've done is upload your manuscript to Barnes and Noble Press for P.O.D. Now, it is true that the other day I uploaded a book easily to B&N Press. Also true, there are no fees for returned books. These are fees which indie authors may incur when a bookstore orders too many of their books from Ingram Spark and decides to return a few of them.

Barnes and Noble Press to P.O.D. is all part of the new B&N, which was bought by a guy in England. His philosophy, as told to us by Mel Glover in June, 2022, is for each Barnes & Noble store to establish relationships with local authors. Simply go to Barnes and Noble Press to sign up, follow instructions to send in your W-9, and you're on your way to uploading your manuscript. Sales will feed income directly into your bank account, just like for KDP Amazon.

In summary, we, as authors, are left with the Ingram-Spark pathway to place our books in the store and on the shelves. Upload your book to Ingram-Spark, and B&N can carry it on their shelves, just like independent bookstores can.
