### Public Safety Stories: When Truth is Stranger than Fiction

Calling all writers of police and detective fiction, mysteries, thrillers, true crime, suspense, disaster, pandemic, and post-apocalyptic works!

Looking for inspiration for your next story? You'll be on the edge of your seat as you listen to true tales from a public safety expert!

Dana Preston is a public safety professional with a background in law enforcement, missing persons, air medical, and disaster response. Dana will take us from his early experiences of establishing a full-service missing persons agency in New England to his time as both a sworn and non-sworn law enforcement officer, to serving in a "boots-on-the-ground" role in the aftermath of Hurricane Andrew, to his current work as part of a disaster response team covering the State of California. Dana will share stories that are serious, sad, funny, or surprising, proving that in some cases "truth is stranger than fiction."

Dana Preston has worked as a security officer, security manager, parking enforcement officer, campus patrol officer, police officer, missing persons investigator, radio communications consultant, amateur radio operator, and communications director for air medical. Dana volunteered with the American

Red Cross Disaster Service for seven years as a Disaster Action Team responder and leader. Dana also has extensive volunteer work with CALSTAR (California Shock Trauma Air Rescue) and has received recognition from Air Angels. Dana is a part of the California Department of Social Services Volunteer Emergency Services Team (VEST) and has taken part in disaster drills and disaster response at the Office of Emergency Services State Operations Center. - have an active email and a phone number that you check regularly
- suggested you have a working website address
